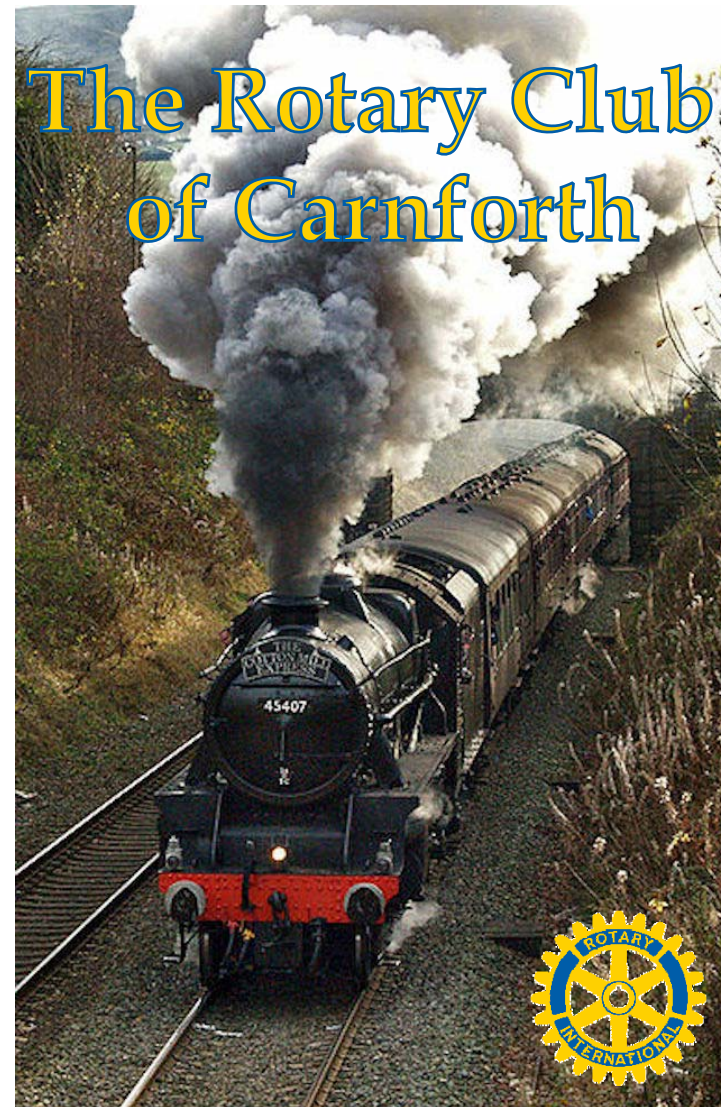

We participate in a wide range of social and fund raising events to support projects within the local community and to provide aid for international relief.



Carnforth Rotary Club has a varied programme of informative guest speakers and enjoy social events such as ladies nights, day trips to local attractions and theatre trips.

Our members give their time and talents to serve the local, national and international communities, in order to help those less fortunate. Rotarians encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help to build goodwill and peace.

The Rotary motto is "Service Above Self" which conveys the humanitarian spirit of over 1.2 million Rotarians in over 200 countries and territories.

Rotary is a non-religious, non-political organisation that is one of the largest non-governmental providers of humanitarian, educational and cultural support programmes in the world.



In times of great need, Rotarians have a reputation for being the first in to help and the last out.

Whether it is aiding flood relief in Cumbria or Pakistan; responding to natural disasters caused by tsunamis, famine, earthquake or disease; tackling illiteracy or clearing up a local town park, there will be a team of Rotarians involved trying to make a difference.

Throughout the world Rotarians have proved that by working together we can achieve a great deal.

Our flagship program, Polio Plus has been the world eradication of polio. Rotarians in association with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation have donated \$555 million since 1985.

Polio has now eradicated in over 125 countries with only 4 countries to be resolved. The reported number of cases has declined by more than 99%.



We support a wide variety of local and international charities each year in addition to Polio Plus that currently include:

North West Air Ambulance Service flying life saving missions throughout the North West region.

St Johns Hospice, Lancaster cares for adults suffering from life-limiting illness and conditions.

Life Education This organisation helps children make healthy choices using a life skills approach.

Shelter Box A charity founded by the Rotary Club of Helston to provide emergency shelter and lifesaving supplies for families around the world affected by disasters.

Second Sight This charity aims to eradicate cataract blindness from India's most neglected areas by 2020.

Kitale Orphans School, Uganda founded by Carnforth Rotarian Mike Willetts in 2006 with just two classrooms for 70 orphan pupils. It now has 6 classrooms for teaching 285 students.
